#### ATTENTION!

Articles of participants Of the international scientific and practical conference “System analysis in the economy-2018” submitted for publication in SCOPUS, must be prepared in accordance with the requirements for publication in SCOPUS.

The manuscript should be accompanied by two reviews in any form (at least one from a foreign scientist, possibly from the CIS countries). Reviews should be in English.

To publish articles that have passed peer review in ISC.

The number of articles to be included in the publication, is limited.

Cost of publication: 30,000 rubles.

Partner universities discount.

Payment for the publication of the article SCOPUS is carried out only after the author receives a message of acceptance of the manuscript for publication and is made on the invoice and receipt.

**Articles should correspond to the subject of the collection.**

### **Requirements to registration of materials**

The article must be original, not previously published, and may not be subsequently published in other publications.

#### **Text structure**

Title (titlepage)

Abstract (abstract)

Methodology (methodology);

Introduction (introduction)

Results (results);

Conclusion/recommendations (conclusions/recommendations);

References (references)

Mandatory requirements for the abstract: the volume of 150-250 words; the structure of the abstract should contain the purpose of the work, methodology, results and conclusion/recommendations.

The title page should include: (1) the title of the article; names; educational institutions and addresses of the authors; (2) the name and full address of the author for correspondence; (3) 5-7 keywords; (4) at least 1 JEL-code (can be several) <http://www.aeaweb.org/jel/guide/jel.php>

Volume of the article: up to 22 thousand characters with spaces.

!!!Footnotes should be used only as a last resort (as an explanation at the end of the article).

Quoting the article: (Adams, 2006) or (Adams and Brown, 2006) or (Adamsetal., 2006).
